Diamond Princess cruise ship forced into quarantine off coast of Yokohama

When most people think of a cruise, tropical weather, palm trees, and unlimited amenities come to mind - not necessarily a fourteen-day quarantine. For the passengers on the Diamond Princess cruise ship, retirement and birthday celebrations quickly lost their excitement when a case of the coronavirus was confirmed in a guest offshore who had previously traveled on the Diamond Princess on February 1st. The guest had traveled one five-day segment of the Diamond Princess' fourteenday itinerary and was diagnosed with the coronavirus in a local Hong Kong hospital six days after disembarking the ship in Yokohama.

On February 4th, Princess Cruises decided to cancel the next Health. voyage of the Diamond Princess for the Japan Ministry of Health to complete their comprehensive review of the health status of all guests and crew, which revealed ten positive tests of the coronavirus from guests. Those infected were transported to onshore hospitals by a Japanese

According to Princess Cruises' daily statements in regards to the "Princess Cruises quarantine, will refund the full cruise fare for all guests including air travel, hotel, ground transportation, prepaid shore excursions, gratuities, and other items. In addition, guests will not be charged

The Diamond Princess cruise ship has been quarantined due to cases of Coronavirus. for any onboard incidental charges during the additional time onboard." Additionally, "[Diamond Princess] has added additional live TV channels and a large selection of in-room movies available in multiple languages. The cruise activities staff is packaging games, puzzles and trivia and delivering them to guest staterooms."

Despite the enhanced guest experience, their efforts to quarantine did not prove effective.

Within the first four days of the official quarantine, over onehundred guests tested positive for the coronavirus. However, as of February 18th, 542 cases of the virus had been identified among the 3,711 quarantined passengers and crew, making the ship the site of the most infections outside of China, according to USA TODAY.

Kentaro Iwata, an infectious disease specialist at Kobe University, posted a scathing youtube video about his visit to the ship on February 18th, stating, "The cruise ship was completely inadequate in terms of the infection control... There was no distinction between the green zone, which is free of infection, and the red zone, which is potentially contaminated by the virus." Iwata was in Africa during the Ebola outbreak, in China in 2003 to help with SARS, and has traveled to various countries to provide assistance with cholera. He said that he was not fearful of acquiring those diseases as the patients and doctors knew how to properly protect themselves from the diseases. However, Iwata was fearful of becoming infected

Trump associate, personal friend Roger Stone sentenced to three years in prison

This past Thursday, Donald longtime Trump's political confidant Roger Stone was sentenced to over three years in federal prison for obstruction of Congress, witness tampering, and false statements. The sentence is one of the more serious ones handed out as a result of Robert Mueller's investigation Russan election interference. The charges, in this case, pertain to

Stone's dishonesty to Congress when making statements about the Trump campaign's theft of and benefit from Democratic Party emails.

Stone and his defense lawyers have actively sought to avoid any prison time, citing his lack of criminal record and his traits as a citizen, even going so far as to say "the process really to some extent has already been the punishment" according to Politico. Donald Trump seems to agree with this

opinion, arguing that the jury and court had an anti-Trump administration bias. He has openly criticized the prosecutors and Justice Department's prosecution. On Twitter, Trump stated "This is a horrible and very unfair situation. The real crimes were on the other side, as nothing happens to them. Cannot allow this miscarriage of justice." Some have argued these tweets lend themselves to the politicization of the Department of Justice and potentially even

greater obstruction of justice.

So far, three men have been sentenced in connection with the Mueller cases. Paul Manafort was sentenced to seven and a half years, Rick Gates to 45 days, and Micheal Cohen getting 3 years for similar charges. Federal prosecutors generally put together sentence recommendations from calculations and factors detailed in a 600-page manual. The threat of perceived politicization pulls

the ship because guests and patients were not properly protecting themselves within the quarantine.Iwata stated that the situation was "completely chaotic," mentioning one scenario where one medical officer had seemingly given up protecting herself and others, believing she was likely already infected.

February 19th was the final day of the quarantine and the first day of the disembarkation process. Although the passengers finally got to leave the ship for the first time in two weeks, the Diamond Princess' passengers were met with a confusing and frustrating array of circumstances.

It is often said that depression is like the common cold. Most people experience it at least once in their lives, and sometimes it disappears on its own. Feeling a little blue is a natural thing, perhaps even a good thing that gives us a moment to think about ourselves.

However, we should remember that even the common cold can develop into a more severe disease without proper treatment. Recurrent depressive thoughts, lethargy, and a sense of despair could be signs of chronic illnesses. They could be detrimental to one's life in work, classes, or even within encounters with close friends. Self-care might work for mild symptoms, but professional help is absolutely necessary in these severe cases.

Dr. Yusef Salam spoke about criminal justice system, major impact on his life

"Yusef Salaam, do you have anything to say before we sentence vou?'

Dr. Yusef Salaam, one of the "Exonerated Five," a group of teenagers wrongfully convicted for the 1998 rape and assault of Trisha Meili in Central Park, opened this week's Common Hour with that question.


The roaring crowd before him quickly quieted. Salaam's arrival was eagerly anticipated, but as he took the stage, the excitement surrounding his visit fell away, replaced with a more somber recognition of his far from glamorous journey here.

Salaam's talk, titled "The Criminal (In)Justice System: Guilty Until Proven Innocent," explored the effects of his false incarceration on his life and the ways he has coped with and overcome the experience. At first, Salaam spoke slowly, deliberately. He'd done seven years for a crime he didn't commit. One of his best friends did thirteen. Oil painting as creative medium, joy in underrated form of art

The joy of oil painting: not watercolor, not gauche, not acrylic, and not kiddie paint. They are all fun, though!

What image comes into your mind when you hear the words "oil painting?" Mona Lisa with her glowing skin and the bluish mountains to frame her face? The Dutch Vanitas, still lives of mortality and secular luxury (or other words, human skulls next to bling)? Or is it a work of Jackson Pollock, those flying streaks of paints? There is no end to the list of famous works created by oil painting

As you can see, oil paint is a paint medium beloved by professional artists due to its versatility, slow drying time, and luminous quality. Well, those are qualities that we non-professional people can love, too! Today, let's find out why oil painting is great and why it might be something you want to try.

First of all, versatility. Oil paint is the most versatile of all paints, and much of it comes from the wide range of consistency and viscosity it can have. Oil paint is traditionally made with pigments and linseed oil, and when squeezed straight out from the tube, it has a nice, heavy creamy texture (the thickness of paint depends on the amount of pigmented suspended, however. Paints with high tinting power tend to be thicker). At the same time, oil painting can be diluted so that it becomes as thin as watercolor paints. This is usually done through paint solvents.

F&M Men's and Women's Swimming compete in CC Championships

Managing Editor This past weekend, the Franklin & Marshall men's and women's swimming teams headed to Gettysburg, PA the weekend took place on Thursday, in which the men's team ended the Host Gettysburg followed closely in place 200-yard Medley Relay team of Alec Wahl, Thomas Graminski, Brendan Cline, and Christopher Schiavone finished with a time of 1:30.69, setting a new CC Championship record. Further, the F&M 800-yard Freestyle Relay team of Cline, Graminski, Alex Sang, and Wahl finished in third with a time of 6:49.66.

The Franklin & Marshall women's swimming team finished the first session of the night in 6th place with a total of 52 points. Swarthmore finished in first with 106 points and Gettysburg in second with 92 points.

On day two of the CC Championships, the No. 21 F&M men's swimming team maintained its first place lead. The Diplomats ended the night with 291.5 points in the top spot while host Gettysburg closely followed in second with 281 points. F&M's Christopher Schiavone fin-

ished in first in the 50-yard Freestyle with a time of 19.99 (B Cut), which established a Gettysburg pool record. F&M's Thomas Graminshi finished in first in the 200-yard IM with a time for the Centennial Conference (CC) of 1:51.19 (B Cut), which set a new Championships. The first session of team record for the event and F&M's Cameron Mehta finished third in the 200-yard IM with a time of 1:53.33 in night with 104 points in first place. order to secure a pair of medals in the event for F&M. Further, F&M's Wilsecond with 98 points and Swarthmore lem Stoll finished fourth in the 500in third with 86 points. F&M's first yard Freestyle at 4:35.13 which set a new team record. Lastly, the 400-yard Medley Relay team of Alec Wahl, Graminski, Jonathon Sinton, and Schiavone finished first with a time of 3:18.88 (B Cut)

The F&M women's swimming team lept past two teams to take fourth on day two of the CC Championships on Friday. The Dips finished with a total 148 points, while Swarthmore finished in first with 306 points and Gettysburg in second with 298.5 points. The 400-yard Medley Relay team of Janashree Jonnalagadda, Maya Blaisure, Skye Howes, and Julie McFadden finished in third at 3:59.89.

On day three of the CC Championships, the No. 21 F&M men's swim team added six medals. The Diplomats ended the night with 533 points in the second spot while host Gettysburg finished in the top spot with 548 points. F&M's Thomas Graminski

finished in first in the 100-yard breast- 200-yard Freestyle Relay team of setting a new CC record for the event. F&M's Cameron Mehta and Alec at 1:36.62 to set a new team record. yard IM and 100-yard Backstroke, a time of 58.58 to set the new team respectively.
